

2025 Tuscaloosa Innovates Business Plan Challenge

Competition Overview and Guidelines

Overview

The business plan challenge provides local entrepreneurs with the opportunity to present a 10-minute PowerPoint business plan. This year the competition is on February 20, kicking off at 8:30 am. We expect the competition to run until about 5 pm, and we will announce the winners that evening.

There are three sets of prizes:

Grand Prize \$10,000 sponsored by AEI

Local Growth Company Prizes, first, second and third prizes sponsored by ASBDC

First Prize \$5,000
 Second Prize \$3,000
 Third Prize \$2,000

New Idea Prizes sponsored by Culverhouse College of Business \$5,000 (may be distributed as one prize or more than one prize)

Winners also have additional in-kind funding from numerous local businesses, including co-working space at The EDGE.

Eligibility

- This competition is open to West Alabama residence ONLY.
 - UA students, faculty, and staff are not qualified to compete as an individual or team idea can only compete in one of our Spring competitions.
 - o Community Competition | ALDAG Competition | Faculty & Staff Competition
- Previous grand prize winners are unable to compete for the same idea again.
- New ideas must be competent, complete, and passable.
- Previous competitors (including 1st-prize and below) can compete with the same idea if they made significant progress since the last presentation.
 - For example, a new line of product added to the business, an expansion, or new service would qualify.
- Additionally, the following conditions must be met:
 - At least one member on the team in a substantial role such as an executive, or co-founder resides in West Alabama or the surrounding area.



- The business/idea is primarily the work of the entrepreneur. Although entrepreneurs may be part of a franchise, to compete for prize money, the business/idea should be internal to the team.
- The AEI team will decide who can compete, and not all entries will be accepted.

Format and Process to Compete

Participants will submit a registration / intent to compete form. After being accepted to compete, the individual will then finalize a PowerPoint presentation that he/she will present. The presentation is a maximum of 10 minutes, and then there will be 15 minutes for the panel of judges to ask questions. Resources to help you get ready are available from the AEI team

The AEI Team, at the EDGE, will be coordinating information sessions, a workshop, one-on-one mentoring, and office hours.
