


How to access BLA and access files from your local computer on BLA

For Windows (Mac instructions located below)


1. Open Remote Desktop App




2. Click "Show Options"




3. Select "Local Resources" tab and then select "More" under "Local Devices and Resources"



4. Select "Drives" and any applicable drives you would like to mount to remote session




5. Download the campus VPN through OIT <https://oit.ua.edu/service/vpn/>
6. Download “Desktop” file from bla.cba.ua.edu (After connecting to VPN), after opening remote desktop you should get this prompt, select “Show Details”



Under show details, select “Drives” to allow the remote computer to access your local drives


7. Once logged into BLA, open Windows Explorer and then “This PC” should show your local drives where your files are stored.




For Mac

1. Ensure that you have [Microsoft Remote Desktop](#) installed on your Mac.
2. **Connect to the Campus VPN**



3. Once you are connected to the campus VPN go to your preferred web browser (Ex: google chrome, safari, etc.)
 - a. Enter bla.cba.ua.edu in the address bar
4. Click on the Desktop Icon and download the rdp file. Save this file in a location you can easily find, such as your desktop.




5. Open up the Microsoft Remote Desktop application and drag the rdp file downloaded from bla into the Microsoft Remote Desktop application.




6. Click the edit tab on rdp file.




- Click on the folders tab, ensure “Redirect folders” is selected, and select the plus icon at the bottom.



- Choose the files or folders you would like to use on BLA and select open.



9. Select Save when you have selected all the files you would like to use on BLA.



10. Once logged into BLA, open Windows Explorer and then “This PC” should show your local drives where your files are stored.
